Document Description:

System jobs are created by the operating system, OS/400, to control system resources and to perform system functions. They begin running when the iSeries server starts, without user input, and perform a variety of tasks, such as starting the operating system, starting and ending subsystems, and scheduling jobs. On the Work with Active Jobs (WRKACTJOB) command display, system jobs are listed alphabetically after all the subsystems and user jobs.
